- Know the exact schedule. Not only should a contractor tell you when they can start the job, but how long will it take? This should be a part of your written estimate. Add a buffer on any period they quote, but you'll

have an idea of what to expect barring any emergencies.

- Ask to see a license and insurance. Don't let just anyone work on your shower. Make sure the contractor is properly licensed and insured. What would happen if he got hurt in your home or did damage to another area of the bathroom while working on the shower? Proper insurance covers issues like these.
- Ask for referrals from people you know. If neighbors, friends, or family recently had their bathroom remodeled, ask what they thought of the contractor and if they'd recommend him.
   When you get referrals from someone you know, you can ask more pointed questions and get straight answers.
- Read the fine print on the contract. Make sure you know all the terms of the work involved. Look for any extra potential charges or other legalities in the fine print that could cost you more money or have unpleasant effects on the outcome.

- Don't pay a contractor
   everything upfront. If a
   contractor asks for full payment
   upfront, it's a sign of a scam. A
   deposit for materials and to
   start the job is acceptable, but
   the remaining funds should be
   due upon completion of the job.
- Read reviews. If you find contractors online, make sure you read the reviews. People are usually willing to share the good and bad aspects of using someone, so read both sides of the reviews to form your own opinion.
- Don't rush into it. Make sure
  you know exactly what you want
  and that the contractor will
  meet your needs. If you rush
  into it, you may not be pleased
  with the job. Take your time and
  find the right contractor.
